## **Message from Board Chair**

Good evening, everyone,

She said:

As Sandra Oh said:

"If you can train yourself not to turn away, but to learn to be with your discomfort — and trust that it might be telling you something you don't yet know... it can help you develop an inner strength that will enable you to face the challenges life presents you with, without losing your values or your sense of self along the way."

At True North, that's exactly what we're doing. Staying steady in who we are, even as we evolve. Holding space for growth *and* for grace.

Thank you to everyone — our board, our staff, our leadership team, our community partners — who has shown up, stayed curious, and chosen courage over comfort. It's not always easy. But it is worth it.



Here's to the work ahead — guided by discomfort, grounded in purpose, and shaped by the values that continue to define us.
